

Membership

"Membership is open to anyone holding an associate (or equivalent such as RN), bachelor's or higher degree from a regionally accredited college or university."

Dues are payable by June 30 and are currently \$83. This includes Red Wing Area Branch (\$15), Minnesota State (\$9) and Association (\$59).

Renewals are due by June 30th to our Treasurer, Jane Hayden-Hart.

AAUW Membership...How it all began!

November 28, 1881 Founders Meet: Marion Talbot and Ellen Richards meet in Boston with 15 alumnae representing eight colleges to discuss the needs of college-educated women. In addition to broadening opportunities and assisting other women in higher education, they discuss the formation of the Association of Collegiate Alumnae.

March 1921: The Southern Association of College Women (founded in 1903) and the Association of Collegiate Alumnae merge to form the American Association of University Women. (AAUW).

1927: Red Wing Area Branch begins with Frances Johnson as its first president.

1931: 50th Anniversary: On its 50th Anniversary, AAUW has 521 branches and 36,800 members. By 1949, those numbers have risen to 1,097 branches and more than 108,000 members.

June 1941 AAUW revises its bylaws to state that the only requirement for membership is a college degree, thereby reaffirming that women college graduates of all races are eligible for membership.

June 1987: AAUW votes to extend membership to male college graduates.

June 2005: Membership Expands: At the 2005 AAUW National Convention in Washington, D.C., AAUW members vote to expand membership to include graduates who hold an associate or equivalent degree from a qualified educational institution in response to the growing population of women who have entered

economically advantageous careers with this kind of educational background.

2018: Today, The American Association of University Women has a membership of over 170,000 strong standing for gender equity. Our very own Red Wing Area Branch begins its 2018-2019 year with 75 members!

Royal Ambassador Hannah Coyle Highlights AAUW

When I decided to join the Red Wing Royal Ambassador Program as a candidate, I knew right away what organization I wanted as my volunteer platform. The American Association for University Women has shown me how to make change, stay strong, and be extraordinary.

Back in January of 2018, I started formulating an idea. I wanted to create a sexual harassment awareness campaign at Red Wing High School. I had a personal experience in December, and it sparked a fire in me. The Red Wing Area Branch of AAUW fostered this idea and encouraged me throughout the process.

By awarding me a grant, AAUW funded the most successful aspect of my campaign. I ordered 110 t-shirts that said "#METOO, We Stand With You." I then handed them out to students for free. All they had to give was a commitment to stand up to sexual harassment.

Previously having chose my volunteer platform, I was invited to speak about my campaign at a RWAB meeting.
Here, very unexpectedly, I was awarded the first ever, Brave New Girl award. Still in awe months later, I want to give back to the organization that empowered me to make change.

The Red Wing Royal Ambassador Program taught me a few things, too. It taught me that there is no reason we

can't all get along. Put aside political parties, religious beliefs, and high school drama because we are all here to live the most successful lives we can The best way to do that is through kindness and teamwork. The RWRA Program fosters strong, independent women. They urge all young women to step outside their comfort zones because no matter what lies in front of them, THEY CAN.

So here I am; a 2018 Red Wing Royal Ambassador, giddy to work with AAUW. I'm excited to continue promoting gender equity and female empowerment while representing Red Wing as the strong, independent woman I've grown to become.
